## Being an Effective Board or Commission Member

- Regular attendance essential.
- Come to meetings on time, prepared, and ready to participate.
- Don't be afraid to ask questions.
- Ask staff for a thorough orientation if one is not offered.
- Participate and share your views.
- Remember, you serve in the public, not personal interests.
- Authority to act is granted to the board, not individual members.
- Think and work as a body, not as an individual.
- The board chair speaks for the board or commission
- Work as a group, respect other views and be ready and willing to compromise.
- Your job is to set policy, regulate or advise the Governor not manage the agency.
- Understand and follow the state ethics laws.
- Follow state travel and financial guidelines.
- If ever in doubt about ethical issues, ask.
- Be committed to openness in government and stand up for open records and open meetings.
- As a board or commission member you are a representative of the governor.
